

## Sunday 30th May 2010

### Old Hill (0pts) 123 lost to Pedmore (10pts) 157 by 34 runs.

Pedmore batted first in the Sunday Border League game at Haden Hill and were all out for 157 runs with Ollie Moseley taking 5 for 29. In reply only Carl Whyte (33) and Reece Shilvock (33) got going with the home side all out for 123 runs to lose by 34 runs.

## Sunday 12th June

### Old Hill (1 point) v Chaddesley Corbett (1 point) Match Abandoned.

Old Hill batted first and looked likely to post a challenging total when the rains came and the match had to be abandoned.

## Sunday 4 July 2010

### Romsley & Hunnington (0 points) 212 - 5 lost to Old Hill (10 points) 214 - 3 by 7 wickets.

Romsley & Hunnington batted first against Old Hill Sunday XI in the Border League game at Bromsgrove Road and scored 212 for 5 wickets off their 40 overs. In reply, Old Hill batsmen scored consistently with Mike Hingley (59) getting them off to a good start and James Hunt (74 not out) and Carl Whyte (39 not out) completing the victory charge to win the game by 7 wickets.

## Sunday 11 July 2010

### Old Hill (0 points) 200 - 6 lost to Waterfront (10 points) 201 - 5.

The Sunday XI batted first scoring 200 - 6 wickets off their 40 overs of which Chris Round (60), Reece Shilvock (34), James Hunt (32) and Mike Hingley (28) the main contributors with the bat. In reply, Waterfront found themselves struggling on 38 - 2 wickets but the game was then marred by a number of dubious decisions which all went against the home side and the visitors eventually reached their target.

## Sunday 18th July

### Pedmore (0 points) 164 lost to Old Hill (10 points) 249 - 4 by 85 runs (2.00 p.m. start)

Batting first, Old Hill Sunday XI posted a large total of 249 - 4 wickets at Rectory Glebe with James Hunt hitting a magnificent 114, Mike Hingley 54 and

Mo Shoaib 31. In reply, Pedmore were never on the pace with only J Wenlan (72) offering any resistance to the visitors' bowlers. Then James Hunt continued his fine form by taking 3 - 32 as the home side were bowled out for 164 to give Old Hill victory by 85 runs to complete a great day for the youngsters after many of the team had played in the morning victory against Kidderminster U17's.

### Sunday 25 July 2010

Old Hill (10 points) 282 - 4 beat Coseley (0 points) 187 - 6 by 95 runs.

The Sunday XI had a comfortable win at home to Coseley in their Border League game. Their total of 282 - 4 was built around a magnificent century by Captain Carl Whyte who finished on 138 not out. There were also good knocks by Reece Shilvock (57) and Sam Perruzza (46 not out). In reply, Coseley were never able to get a momentum going and finished on 187 - 6 at the completion of their 40 overs as Old Hill coasted to victory.

### Sunday 1 August 2010

Chaddesley Corbett (0 points) 124 lost to Old Hill (10 points) 197 - 2.

A wonderful display by the whole of the Sunday XI in their game at Chaddesley Corbett gave Old Hill victory by 73 runs. Taking first knock, the visitors amassed a large total of 197 for the loss of only 2 wickets off their 40 overs thanks to excellent batting by Reece Shilvock (93 not out), Captain Carl Whyte (52) and James Hunt (46 not out). In reply, Chaddesley Corbett struggled throughout their innings and were bowled out for just 124 runs with Dan Such taking 4 wickets for 29 runs as Old Hill cruised to victory.

### Sunday 8 August 2010

Stourport (0 points) conceded to Old Hill (10 points).

The Sunday XI's game due to take place at Haden Hill was conceded by their opponents giving Old Hill maximum points to add to their run of 4 victories in the last 5 games after a poor start to the season.

### Sunday 15 August 2010

Old Hill (10 points) 211 - 3 beat Belbroughton (0 points) by 4 runs.

The Sunday XI batted first in their game against Belbroughton at Haden Hill on a warm sunny afternoon - a sharp contrast to yesterday's wet weather - and made a steady start to their innings after the early loss of Chris Bending who was run out without scoring. However, the innings blossomed in the last 10 overs

as James Hunt (57) joined opener Mike Hingley (112 not out) who carried his bat for an unbeaten century as Old Hill added 120 runs in this period as they finished on 211 - 3 wickets off their 40 overs. In reply Belbroughton got off to a disastrous start losing 2 wickets with only 4 runs on the board but they then "steadied the ship" and thanks to some late lusty blows by Matt Spells (73 not out) got to within 4 runs of the home side's total for the loss of 8 wickets as Old Hill held their nerve to gain a deserved victory in a tight finish with James Hunt 3 - 38 and Captain Carl Whyte 2 - 37 the major wicket takers as the home side recorded their fifth straight win to stay in contention for the title.

### Sunday 22 August 2010

#### Old Hill (10 points) 243 - 6 beat Romsley & Hunnington (0 points) by 94 runs.

On a lovely warm and sunny afternoon, the Border League Division 1 game was played out in front of a large crowd basking in the sunshine. Batting first, Old Hill's batsmen scored consistently to post a very competitive score of 243 - 6 wickets from their 40 overs with Jared Daniels (47), Mike Hingley (35), Captain Carl Whyte (33) and Nick Couzens (33 not out) being the leading run getters. Romsley's reply got off to a poor start with 2 wickets being lost for just 11 runs in the first 4 overs and but for a ninth wicket stand of 44 runs, they would have been bowled out very cheaply as Old Hill's youngsters set about their task. Nathan Davies (3 - 25), Dan Such (2 - 20), Nick Couzens (2 - 22) and Jon Baig (2 - 30) were the main wicket takers with the visitors being bowled out for 149 runs in 36.2 overs as Old Hill won comfortably by 94 runs to remain in contention for the League Title with their sixth consecutive victory.

### Sunday 5 September 2010

#### Waterfront (0 points) 100 lost to Old Hill (10 points) by 111 runs.

In the top of the Table clash between the Sunday XI and League leaders Waterfront at Chaddesley Corbett, Old Hill batted first and scored 211 for the loss of 8 wickets off their 40 overs with James Hunt (46), Chris Round (58) and Carl Whyte (64 not out) - the visitors leading batsmen. Then, a combination of excellent bowling by James Hunt 4 - 20 and Nigel Davenport 3 - 0, backed up by some brilliant fielding, Waterfront were "shot out" for just 100 as Old Hill won by a massive 111 runs to finish just one point off top spot as they completed the second half of the season unbeaten with seven consecutive victories.
